

## Information on Voting Photo ID Requirement

Beginning with the 2016 Spring Primary, all Wisconsin voters must show an acceptable photo ID before voting. This includes voters at polling places and many absentee voters.

- You will need to show one of the photo ID types listed below. Please note that there is no such thing as a "Voter ID Card."

### VOTING AND ACCEPTABLE PHOTO IDs

The following photo IDs are acceptable, even if they are recently expired (as long as the ID did not expire before November 4, 2014).

- A **Wisconsin Driver License**, even if driving privileges are revoked or suspended
- A **Wisconsin Identification Card** issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles (available for free)
- A **Military ID** card issued by a U.S. uniformed service
- A **U.S. Passport**

The following IDs are also acceptable but cannot be expired:

- A Wisconsin Driver License receipt or Wisconsin Identification Card receipt issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles (valid for 45 days after it is issued)
- A Certificate of Naturalization that was issued not earlier than two years before the date of the election
- A photo identification card issued by a Wisconsin accredited university or college that contains (1) date of issuance, (2) signature of student, and (3) an expiration date no later than two years after date of issuance. **Also, the university or college ID must be accompanied by a separate document that proves current enrollment**, such as a tuition fee receipt, enrollment verification letter or class schedule.
